

Boundary mark Czech Republic - Bayern IX35

This boundary mark is one of many historic boundary marks of the active boundaries of the Czech Republic.

The boundary mark was fitted in place in the year 1765. The boundary mark is sculpted of granite. Colour of the boundary mark is white. On the Czech face of the mark, there is a Czech national symbol – two-tailed lion and letter C (stands for Czech Rep., former letters were CS for Czechoslovakia and even older were KB for Königreich Böhmen), while on the German face, there is Bavarian coat of arms in lesser variant (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Coat_of_arms_of_Bavaria) and a letter D (Deutschland). On the top of the boundary mark, there are carved cross and two lines. The cross is referential point for measuring and the lines are pointed to neighbouring boundary marks.
