



A main border sign called "the Versailles Stone" which marked the border between the Free City of Gdańsk and the German province of Eastern Prussia along the Vistula Spit in the years 1921-1939.

A granite block about 80 cm high above ground and 41x41 cm wide. Its opposite sides bear a carved inscription referring to the place and date of signing the peace treaty which ended the Great War: Versailles / 28.6.1919; on the other two sides, respectively: FD = Free City of Gdańsk and D = Germany. Carvings on the flat top of the block show the direction of the borderline.

This Versailles Stone is the only one surviving "in situ" out of the 8 surviving to-date and of the total 33 such stones once placed along the Polish-German, Polish-Gdańsk, and Gdańsk-German border. Several other, smaller landmark stones can be seen a little south of this one.

Forest on the Vistula Spit sand dune, north-west of the village of Przebrno, part of the town Krynica Morska, Nowy Dwór county, Pomeranian Province.
